The 2024-25 application fee for a new carrier licence is \$205.65.

If you are unsure as to which licence may be applicable to your specific activities, please provide DFSV with a statement of intent (via email to info@dairysafe.vic.gov.au) that accurately and fully describes the products and processes you will be undertaking. This will assist DFSV to accurately assess what dairy licence best fits your business needs.

Please note that it may take up to 60 days for a carrier licence to be approved.

You are also advised that, under the provisions of the *Dairy Act 2000*, it is unlawful to engage in dairy farming, carrying, manufacturing or distribution activities in relation to Dairy Products until such time as a relevant licence has been issued authorising those activities.
